# The Pace of Change in Great Britain

This newsletter provides a brief update of the key wholesale electricity market design changes currently being progressed within Great Britain, focusing on November 2006.

The newsletter aims to assist electricity market participants who already have a good broad understanding of the GB electricity trading arrangements, and the key documents that underpin them, to keep track of the major consultations that affect the development of the wholesale electricity market. A number of other consultations/decisions that may be relevant are also noted.

This issue covers: Ofgem consultations; publications/announcements by a number of government and other bodies; the EU Emissions Trading Scheme; consultations and reports by National Grid (NGET), and new BSC and CUSC Modifications, decisions, and related matters. This edition also identifies press releases from the EU that may be relevant to the British electricity wholesale sector.

## HEADLINES

- Malcolm Wicks has moved from Energy Minister to become Minister of State for Science and Innovation. Alistair Darling retains overall responsibility for the department and its policies including leading on energy. He will be supported by Lord Truscott who becomes Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Energy.
- Ofgem has confirmed that it will be undertaking impact assessments for all four of the BSC transmission losses modifications and that this will mean that it will not be in a position to give a decision before 22 March 2007. Consequently, the earliest date any of these modifications could now be implemented would be 1 October 2008 (it could have been 1 April 2008 if a decision was made before 22 March 2007).
- Ofgem and the energy regulators for France, Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland have initiated a joint consultation on the integration of their electricity markets. Comments are requested by 19 January 2007.
- The Commission has published a communication on the scope of the review of the EU ETS and the further development of arrangements for Phase 3.
- The EC has given conditional approval to ten of the National Allocation Plans for the second phase of the EU ETS. For all but the UK, these include a reduction in the number of allowances to be issued. The UK's plan is approved subject to amendments to deal with installations in Gibraltar.

Ofgem/DTI has issued a joint consultation on two options for licensing the transmission connections

between generators located in offshore waters and onshore electricity networks. The two options are either to grant non exclusive licences to any party satisfying relevant (defined) criteria or to mirror the on-shore arrangements allowing for a geographical monopoly in provision of transmission assets. The consultation indicates that Ofgem favours the second options – DTI does not give a view.

The consultation also includes, as an appendix, an outline of how the changes to licences and codes that are needed to implement the new off-shore transmission licensing arrangements will be implemented using the powers under the Energy Act. The current timetable is reproduced below.

**May 2006 - Q2 2007** - Development of proposed modifications to codes, licences, standards through Offshore Transmission Expert Group (OTEG) sub-groups and discussion with industry and the relevant panels.

**Q2 2007** - DTI/Ofgem publish initial legal framework, setting out proposed range of licence and code modifications and any consequential modifications & inviting comments.

**Q3 2007** - DTI/Ofgem publish draft legal texts of all modifications, inviting comments.

**Q4 2007** - Final 12-week consultation on the full regulatory model and final legal texts.

**Q2 2008** - Energy Act 2004 powers are commenced, Secretary of State uses powers under sections 90 and 91 to designate modifications.

intention to undertake regulatory impact assessments for all of the four BSC Modification proposals dealing with transmission losses. The letter also states that Ofgem “anticipates” publishing the impact assessments, in a single document, in “early 2007” and that, consequently, it does not expect to be in a position to give a decision on these modifications by 22 March 2007. This date is relevant because, if any modifications are approved, the implementation date is dependent on the time the Authority gives its decision. If a decision was given before 22 March the change would be implemented on 1 April 2008 but would slip to 1 October 2008 for a decision after 22 March but before 20 September 2007.

Ofgem has issued a press release announcing a joint consultation by the energy regulators for France, Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland on the integration of their electricity markets.

The press release states that the initiative was launched by the European Regulators Group for Electricity and Gas (ERGEG). The key issues that have been highlighted for this region include:

- “congestion management for interconnectors”;
- “enhancing reciprocal access to balancing markets”; and

Ofgem has issued an open letter seeking views on proposals to revoke licences in the following circumstances:

Where the licence is held by licensees that:

- are insolvent (“insolvent licensees”);
- have not commenced the licensable activity for which they are licensed within the time specified in the licence; or
- have ceased the licensable activity for which they are licensed.

The letter states that Ofgem already revokes licences where the licence is not being used and the licensee requests that it is revoked (and where Ofgem agrees that the licence should be revoked) and where insolvent suppliers are subject to the Supplier of Last Resort arrangements, but has not done so in other circumstances.

Ofgem has published a consultation on a review of the application of two standard conditions within the generation licence that are switched on in some, but not all, generation licences. The standard licence conditions are: SLC 14 (relating to the compulsory acquisition of land) and SLC 15 (relating to other powers in relation to land). The review is intended to address any potential inconsistencies in the way SLCs 14 and 15 are applied across electricity generation licence holders. Three options are considered:

- improve consistency by giving effect to SLC 14 and SLC 15 in all electricity generation licences;
- improve consistency by removing SLC 14 and SLC

- 15 from effect in all electricity generation licences; or
- maintaining the current approach of considering each application on a case by case basis.

The review follows requests from 8 licensed generators, over recent years, for these conditions to be switched on.

Government has published its decision following the DTI's consultation (in July) on proposals to amend NFFO contracts for municipal and industrial waste projects with CHP to correct an anomaly that meant that a generator could earn more for the electricity generated if they did not fulfill their heat commitment than if they did. The changes proposed in July were implemented via the secondary legislation (SI number 2388: Electricity from Non-Fossil Fuel Sources Arrangements (England and Wales)) which came into force on 1 October 2006.

The Commission has published a communication on the scope of the review of the EU ETS and the further development of arrangements for Phase 3. The four broad categories cover:

- Expansion of the scope of the scheme to include other sectors and gasses;

The report notes that the Commission, Council and European Parliament have all expressed support for bringing aviation into the EU ETS and anticipates legislation coming forward in the “next few months” .

- Further harmonisation and greater predictability;

The Commission expresses support for providing longer term certainty. Options for increasing “harmonisation” of the processes for setting national caps are considering including the option of setting a single EU wide cap.

- Robust enforcement and compliance; and

Consideration is being given to whether the monitoring and reporting guidelines should be laid down in a regulation.

- Involving third countries.

Consideration is being given to linking into schemes into other existing or emerging schemes in non EU countries.

The communication also notes the Commission’s commitment to maintaining recognition of the Kyoto project based mechanisms beyond 2012.

The work is being progressed by an existing ECCP (European Climate Change Programme) sub group covering emissions trading. The level of ambition post 2012 is to be the subject of a separate communication.
